

PRIVACY NOTICE ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA IN THE REGISTER OF PROPERTY SEIZURE ACTS

■ For what purposes is your personal data processed in the Register of Property Seizure Acts (hereinafter referred to as the Register or TAAR)?	Personal data is processed for registering objects of the Register, for collecting, accumulating, processing, systematising, storing and providing complete and correct data about the objects of the Register.	
■ What is the lawful basis under the General Data Protection Regulation for processing of your personal data?	Processing of your personal data is carried out in compliance with a legal obligation (Article 6(1)(c) of the General Data Protection Regulation (hereinafter referred to as the GDPR)). The processing of personal data shall be set forth in: Law of the Republic of Lithuania on the Register of Property Seizure Acts Regulations of the Register of Property Seizure Acts approved by Resolution No 314 of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania of 5 March 2002 (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations).

Whose personal data and what personal data are processed?		
Debtor:	Name, surname, personal identity code granted by the Population Register of the Republic of Lithuania; if there is no data of a natural person in the Population Register, the person's date of birth and a foreign country that issued the identity document to a person. Other data related to the property seizure act (date and time of receiving the property seizure act or its data in the Register, registration number, date of adoption of the property seizure act; date and time of the registration of the property seizure act, its deregistration, data entry and change in the Register; identification code of the property seizure act; ways of property seizure; extent of the property seizure; period of the property seizure; specific amount of funds).	
Creditor:	Name, surname, personal identity code; if there is no data of a natural person in the Population Register, the person's date of birth and a foreign country that issued an identity document to a person. Other data related to the property seizure act (date and time of receiving the property seizure act or its data in the Register, registration number, date of adoption of the property seizure act; date and time of the registration of the property seizure act, its deregistration, data entry and change in the Register; identification code of the property seizure act; ways of property seizure; extent of the property seizure; period of the property seizure; specific amount of funds).	
Owner or co-owners of the seized property:	Name, surname, personal identity code; if there is no data of a natural person in the Population Register, the person's date of birth and a foreign country that issued an identity document to a person.	
Natural person of a caretaker or administrator of seized property:	Name, surname, personal identity code; if there is no data of a natural person in the Population Register, the person's date of birth.	
Authorised official of the institution that adopted a property seizure act, its amendment or a decision to withdraw the property seizure:	Name, surname, office position, name of the institution.	
Person authorised by the data provider:	Name, surname, position.	
Data recipients:	Name, surname, personal identity code, workplace name, IP address, contact data (telephone number, e-mail address).	



▼ Where is your personal data received from?

Register data providers are courts, bailiffs, prosecutors, State Tax Inspectorate, State Social Insurance Fund administrative institutions, the Customs
Department under the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Lithuania, the Bank of Lithuania, other state institutions and officials with the right to seize
property.

▼ Whom your personal data may be provided to?

- Natural persons and legal entities who have a legitimate objective and legal basis to receive the data after specifying the purpose of the Register data use and condition of legal processing of personal data.
- Data related to the fact of registration of a specific property seizure act in the Register (Extract from the Register certifying the fact of presence or absence of a property seizure in the Register), may be provided to any natural person and/or legal entity who has indicated the purpose of the Register data use.
- Data processors involved who provide Register development, maintenance and/or other related services.

▼ How long will your personal data be retained?

- Data on deregistered property seizure acts shall be retained in the database archive for 10 years from the date of deregistration of the property seizure act.
- Documents of property seizure acts shall be retained in the archive for 5 years from the date of deregistration of the property seizure act.

At the end of the data and document retention period, the Register data and documents shall be deleted and destroyed.

▼ What rights do you have as a data subject and how can you exercise them?

You as a data subject are entitled to address the Centre of Registers for any issues related to processing of your personal data, i.e. you have the following rights:

- The right of access to data (Article 15 of the GDPR)
- The right to rectification of data (Article 16 of the GDPR)



• The right to restriction of processing (Article 18 of the GDPR). Note: this right may be exercised when at least one of the conditions set out in Article 18(1) GDPR is met. Personal data, the processing of which is restricted, can be processed (except for retention) only after obtaining a consent of the data subject, or for the purpose of establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims, or for the protection of the rights of another natural person or legal entity, or for reasons of important public interest of the European Union or of the Republic of Lithuania.

Please note that the following data subject rights do not apply to you:

- You do not have the right to data portability in accordance with Article 20 of the GDPR, as the TAAR does not process personal data based on your consent in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) or Article 9(2)(a) of the GDPR, or an agreement in accordance with Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR.
- You do not have the right to object to data processing in accordance with Article 21 of the GDPR, as the Register does not process personal data in accordance with Article 6(1)(e) or (f) of the GDPR, including profiling.
- You do not have the right to request the exclusion of a decision based solely on automated data processing, including profiling, pursuant to Article 22(2)(b) GDPR.
- You do not have the right to request the erasure of personal data ('right to be forgotten') pursuant to the exception set out in Article 17(3)(b) of the GDPR.
